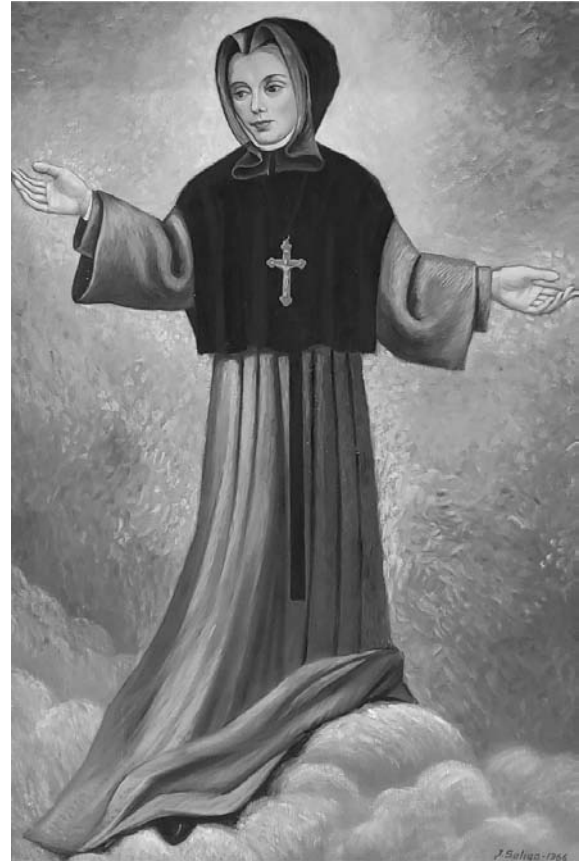

The gospel for this Sunday recalls the Galilee storm that threatens to submerge the fishing boat of the panic-stricken disciples. In contrast, the roused-from-sleep Jesus reveals his sovereign power of the forces of chaos. The hard learned Christian lesson of trusting in the midst of panic is one that needs constant reinforcement: the life of Helene Kafka offers inspiration on how to remain calm and focused on Our Lord even when facing overwhelming intimidation.

Born in the modern day Czech Republic, Helen entered religious life with the Franciscan Sisters of Charity to serve as a nurse. Her chosen professed name was a play on words – not only would she serve as one to help restore the health of the sick but given her corpulent size, one who was “restored” was recognized as being full-figured. She had a disposition to remain focused and unfazed under pressure, especially in dealing with some of the enormous egos of the doctors she served with at the hospital in Vienna. She was put in charge of overseeing the operating room based on her ability to keep an environment that was thoroughly sterilized, efficiently organized under high-pressure conditions. Insisting that crucifixes be placed in all hospital rooms, she was eventually charged with aiding the enemy of the Nazi regime and condemned to the guillotine.

For those mildly familiar with 20th century existential literature, her last name is shared by the novelist, Franz Kafka. In his notable work, “metamorphosis,” the pervasive societal attitude of isolation and gloom are conveyed as the author wakes up to view himself as a filthy cockroach. The loss of faith, family and meaningful relationships plunges the author into a repulsive self-loathing. By contrast, Bl. Maria Restituta Kafka would have had every reason to be weighed down by her own insecurities and the very real misery that surrounded her yet, her resilient faith allowed her to remain afloat over the treacherous waters of her day with admirable, inspiring courage.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

“Do you not yet have faith?” Our Lord’s question in today’s Gospel frames the Sunday liturgies for the remainder of the year, which the Church calls “Ordinary Time.” In the weeks ahead, the Church’s liturgy will have us journeying with Jesus and His disciples, reliving their experience of His words and deeds, coming to know and believe in Him as they did.

Notice that today’s Psalm almost provides an outline for the Gospel. We sing of sailors caught in a storm; in their desperation, they call to the Lord and He rescues them.

Mark’s Gospel today also intends us to hear a strong echo of the story of the prophet Jonah. He, too, was found asleep on a boat when a life-threatening storm broke out that caused his fellow travelers to pray for deliverance, and then to marvel when the storm abated. But Jesus is something greater than Jonah. And Mark wants us to come to see what the Apostles saw—that God alone has the power to rebuke the wind and the sea.

This is the point of today’s First Reading. If even the wind and sea obey Him, shouldn’t we trust Him in the chaos and storms of our own lives? As with the Apostles, the Lord has asked each of us to cross to the other side, to leave behind our old ways to travel with Him in the little ship of the Church.

In their fear today, they call Him, “Teacher.” And it is only faith in His teaching that can save us from perishing. We should trust in Christ, and trust like Christ—who was able to sleep through the storm, confident that God was with Him.

We should live in thanksgiving for our salvation, as today’s Epistle tells us—as new creations, no longer for ourselves but for Him who died for our sake.
