Father, in the peace of this church help me to pray for all who have to travel. May they be always in your care, finding peace in their journeys, and may they reach their destinations in safety, through the love of Jesus Christ our Lord.

- Prayer for safety in travel found in the Church of St. Botolph, London As summer begins and for those fortunate to have destinations on the horizon, the otherwise obscure story of St. Botolph can be of help. This 7th century abbot established his monastery on the eastern English shores of Suffolk county. During his lifetime, Botolph was a man of great erudition and prayer and his engineering abilities helped drain the marshes in the surrounding region leading to regional prosperity. After his death, his relics were dispersed around the city gates of London with numerous churches adopting his patronage. For those venturing out of the city and facing danger in voyage, his intercession was sought and his protection thanked upon safe return. When pilgrims left to settle across the Atlantic, they carried his legacy with them dedicating a colonial town in his honour, Botolphstown. The lengthy name was subsequently shortened to "Botolphston" and eventually to its more familiar, "Boston," As history documents, the city of Boston would hold stage in America's break from England: the Boston Tea party, the Boston Massacre, Paul Revere's night time ride to warn the Patriots, the battle of Bunker Hill were all key pivotal moments that transformed the humble Quaker pilgrim origins of its citizens into the Revolutionary Boston Strong metropolis. On approach from the south side to the famous Fenway Park where the Red Sox play, the city still recalls its saintly origins with a street named after Saint Botolph.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God, who formed us in His imperishable image, did not intend for us to die, we hear in today's First Reading. Death entered the world through the devil's envy and Adam and Eve's sin; as a result, we are all bound to die. But in the moving story in today's Gospel, we see Jesus liberate a little girl from the possession of death.



On one level, Mark is recounting an event that led the disciples to understand Jesus' authority and power over even the final enemy, death. On another level, however, this episode is written to strengthen our hope that we too will be raised from the dead, along with all our loved ones who sleep in Christ.

Jesus commands the girl to "Arise!"—using the same Greek word used to describe His own resurrection. And the consoling message of today's Gospel is that Jesus is the resurrection and the life. If we believe in Him, even though we die, we will live.

We are called to have the same faith as the parents in the Gospel today—praying for our loved ones, trusting in Jesus' promise that even death cannot keep us apart. Notice the parents follow Him even though those in their own house tell them there is no hope, and even though others ridicule Jesus' claim that the dead have only fallen asleep.

Already in Baptism, we've been raised to new life in Christ. And the Eucharist, like the food given to the little girl today, is the pledge that He will raise us on the last day.

We should rejoice, as we sing in today's Psalm, that He has brought us up from the netherworld, the pit of death. And, as Paul exhorts in today's Epistle, we should offer our lives in thanksgiving for this gracious act, imitating Christ in our love and generosity for others.

WHAT FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION PARTICIPANTS




