Our Lady of Castelmonte, You have always protected and defended Your followers; watch over us with motherly eyes as we place so much faith in You. We are poor sinners but You are our Holy Mother. We repent our wrong doings and we confide in Your motherly goodness. Holy Mary, You are aware of our grief and of our hopes: intercede with Jesus for our needs, pray with us. Make sure that we always worship the will of our Father and that the pain and the difficulties of life will never suffocate our trust in You. On the Holy Cross Jesus has entrusted us to Your maternal concern; protect us and help us in our sorrows. O Holy Virgin of Castelmonte, many have come to You and were granted: listen to our humble prayer.

#### Prayer to Our Lady of Castelmonte, Cividale, Friuli, Italy

Tucked away high up in the Alps, close to the Italian/Slovenian border, the majestic Shrine of Our Lady of Castelmonte adorns the mountain peaks. Originally set up as an ancient Roman guard post, given its strategic vantage point, the site played a key role as a first line of defense and alarm from invading barbarian tribes from the North and the East. With the Council of Ephesus heralding Mary as "Mother of God," her intercession and veneration was invoked as a sure source of protection and heavenly favour. Graces attributed to her assistance was credited as having delivered them from the Turkish menace of the late 15<sup>th</sup> century, preserving the surrounding region from Protestant influence in the 16-17<sup>th</sup> century, averting even further calamity throughout the 20<sup>th</sup> century World Wars, as well as countless other earthquakes, floods and natural disasters. On September 8, 1479, the current statue of Our Lady of Castelmonte, tenderly comforting her Divine Son, was completed and placed in the centre of the sanctuary in thanksgiving for a ratified peace treaty between the Ottoman Empire and neighbouring Venice. The local Friulian faithful continue to trek their way up the long and steep slope of the mountain, on this very day, to express their gratitude and devotion.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The incident in today's Gospel is recorded only by Mark. The key line is what the crowd says at the end: "He has done all things well." In the Greek, this echoes the creation story, recalling that God saw all the things He had done and declared them good.



Mark also deliberately evokes Isaiah's promise, which we

hear in today's First Reading, that God will make the deaf hear and the mute speak. He even uses a Greek word to describe the man's condition that's only found in one other place in the Bible—in the Greek translation of today's Isaiah passage, where the prophet describes the "dumb" singing.

The crowd recognizes that Jesus is doing what the prophet had foretold. But Mark wants us to see something far greater—that, to use the words from today's First Reading: "Here is your God."

Notice how personal and physical the drama is in the Gospel. Our focus is drawn to a hand, a finger, ears, a tongue, spitting. In Jesus, Mark shows us, God has truly come in the flesh.

What He has done is to make all things new, a new creation. As Isaiah promised, He has made the living waters of Baptism flow in the desert of the world. He has set captives free from their sins, as we sing in today's Psalm. He has come that rich and poor might dine together in the Eucharistic feast, as James tells us in today's Epistle.

He has done for each of us what He did for that deaf mute. He has opened our ears to hear the Word of God and loosed our tongues that we might sing praises to Him.

Let us then give thanks to our glorious Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Let us say with Isaiah, "Here is our God, He comes to save us." Let us be rich in faith, that we might inherit the kingdom promised to those who love Him.
