In the wake of so much hatred, violence and destruction, we want to thank Our Lady for continuing to bring us Jesus, who alone has the power to heal open wounds and to restore peace to broken hearts. But we also want to ask her to implore for us the grace of God's mercy. We ask also for the grace to make reparation for our sins and for all the evil which this land has known.

It is not easy to do this. Yet only when we come to understand, in the light of the Cross, the evil we are capable of, and have even been a part of, can we experience true remorse and true repentance. Only then can we receive the grace to approach one another in true contrition, offering and seeking true forgiveness. In this difficult effort to forgive and find peace, Mary is always here to encourage us, to guide us, to lead us. Just as she forgave her Son's killers at the foot of his Cross, then held his lifeless body in her hands, so now she wants to guide Sri Lankans to greater reconciliation, so that the balm of God's pardon and mercy may bring true healing to all.

Pope Francis' Address while at the Shrine of Our Lady of Madhu, January 2015

On the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows (September 15), the story of this Sri Lankan devotion encapsulates well the closeness of the Mother who was given to us at the foot of the Cross. With the successful spread of the Christian faith in neighbouring Velankani, the body of water separating the two countries, known as Palk Strait, saw a similar statue in appearance make its way onto the island nation in the 16th century. The small community of Catholic Christians then faced danger not only from the local Buddhist and Hindu populations, but Dutch Protestants, in hostile competition with the Portuguese and Spanish, threatened to destroy the small Christian mission that had established itself in the Jaffna peninsula. Consequently, the Sri Lankan Catholics fled into the jungle taking refuge in their newly founded location that became Madhu.

The cited talk is Pope Francis' effort to bring reconciliation from the 30 year Sinhalese/ Tamil civil war that ended in 2009 that resulted in almost 70,000 dead. While smoldering resentments from past civil conflict may be easing, a debt crisis, political turmoil and a collapse in the supply chain has brought new anxieties to the troubled country with many asylum seekers fleeing their homeland to find better elsewhere. It is right then that the intercession of Our Blessed Mother, present right in the middle of Sri Lanka's troubles, is invoked to help bring the promise of salvation, relief, and stability found in her Son – especially in a nation where those baptized remain but a small minority.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In today's Gospel, we reach a pivotal moment in our walk with the Lord. After weeks of listening to His words and witnessing His deeds, along with the disciples we're asked to decide who Jesus truly is.

From the Pastor's desk

Peter answers for them, and for us, too, when he declares: "You are the Messiah." Many expected the Messiah to be a miracle worker who would vanquish Israel's enemies and restore the kingdom of David.

Jesus today reveals a different portrait. He calls Himself the Son of Man, evoking the royal figure Daniel saw in his heavenly visions. But Jesus' kingship is not to be of this world. And the path to His throne, as He reveals, is by way of suffering and death.

Jesus identifies the Messiah with the suffering servant that Isaiah foretells in today's First Reading. The words of Isaiah's servant are Jesus' words—as He gives Himself to be shamed and beaten, trusting that God will be His help. We hear our Lord's voice again in today's Psalm, as He gives thanks that God has freed Him from the cords of death.

As Jesus tells us today, to believe that He is the Messiah is to follow His way of self-denial—losing our lives to save them in order to rise with Him to new life. Our faith, we hear again in today's Epistle, must express itself in works of love.

Notice that Jesus questions the Apostles today "along the way." They are on the way to Jerusalem, where the Lord will lay down His life. We, too, are on a journey with the Lord.

We must take up our cross, giving to others and enduring all our trials for His sake and the sake of the Gospel.

Our lives must be an offering of thanksgiving for the new life He has given us until that day when we reach our destination and walk before the Lord in the land of the living.
